ITEM 1 OPENING OF MEETING

1.1 Opening

The Chief Executive Officer declared the meeting open at 5:35 pm and acknowledged the traditional owners, the Kariyarra people.

1.2 Swearing in Ceremony

- Councillor David Hooper, elected for a four (4) year term
- Councillor Lorraine Butson, elected for a four (4) year term
- Councillor Troy Melville, elected for a four (4) year term
- Councillor David Van Vugt, elected for a two (2) year term.

The ceremony comprised of the Oath or Affirmation of Allegiance as required under the Local Government (Constitution) Regulations 1996 and the Declaration by Elected Member under s 2.29 of the Local Government Act 1995.

The Mayor assumed the Chair at 5:43pm.

Election of Deputy Mayor

Nominations were called by the Chief Executive Officer for the position of Deputy Mayor in accordance with Schedule 2.3, Part 8 of the *Local Government Act 1995*. The appointment is for a two year term, with the position being considered following every ordinary election.

- 8. How deputy mayor or deputy president is elected
- (1) The council is to elect a Councillor (other than the Mayor) to fill the office.
- (2) The election is to be conducted in accordance with the procedure prescribed, by the Mayor, or if he or she is not present, by the Chief Executive Officer.
- (3) Nominations for the office are to be given to the person conducting the election in writing, before the meeting or during the meeting before the close of nominations.
- (3a) Nominations close at the meeting at a time announced by the person conducting the election, which is to be a sufficient time after the announcement by that person that nominations are about to close to allow for any nominations made to be dealt with.
- (4) If a Councillor is nominated by another Councillor the person conducting the election is not to accept the nomination unless the nominee has advised the person conducting the election, orally or in writing, that he or she is willing to be nominated for the office.
- (5) The council members are to vote on the matter by secret ballot as if they were electors voting at an election.
- (6) Subject to clause 9(1) the votes cast under subclause (5) are to be counted, and the successful candidate determined, in accordance with Schedule 4.1 as if those votes were votes cast at an election.
- (7) As soon as is practicable after the result of the election is known, the Chief Executive Officer is to declare and give notice of the result in accordance with regulations, if any.
- 9. Votes may be cast a second time
- (1) If, when the votes cast under clause 8(5) are counted, there is an equality of votes between 2 or more candidates who are the only candidates in, or remaining in, the count, the count is to be discontinued and, not more than 7 days later, a special meeting of the council is to be held.

- (2) Any nomination for the office may be withdrawn, and further nominations may be made, before or when the special meeting is held.
- (3) When the special meeting is held the council members are to vote again on the matter by secret ballot as if they were voting at an election.
- (4) The votes cast under subclause (3) are to be counted, and the successful candidate determined, under Schedule 4.1 as if those votes were votes cast at an election.

The following nominations were received at 5:47pm:

All Elected Members casted their votes by way of secret ballot.

Votes were counted at 5:53pm by Mr Robert Fry, JP, in the presence of the Chief Executive Officer and the Governance Coordinator.

Outcome of the vote count:

- Janet Gillingham 3 votes
- Penny Taylor 1 vote
- Gloria Jacob 4 votes

The Chief Executive Officer declared that Gloria Jacob was the Councillor elected as Deputy Mayor. Gloria Jacob read the Oath or Affirmation of Allegiance as required under the Local Government (Constitution) Regulations 1996 and the Declaration by Elected Member under s 2.29 of the Local Government Act 1995 before Mr Robert Fry, JP.
