5.1 Michelle Cook

Ms Cook asked whether anything can be done about buses, especially 12 seaters, continuously parking in the two-minute bay outside the airport. At the moment there is no structure, maybe a system where parking times are staggered could be set up?

Director Engineering Services advised that there are issues that need to be addressed at this location. These being the designation of a bus lane with associated signage, and more staff to monitor and enforce parking. The Town of Port Hedland has established a relationship with buses that regularly pick up workers however lately new buses have started to arrive and they need to be contacted accordingly. consideration will be given to allocating funds towards the construction of a designated bus lane.

Ms Cook also asked whether anything could be done about people having their flight delayed and becoming inebriated at the airport cafe`.

Director Engineering Services and Chairperson advised that it is up to the cafe's licensee to ensure that staff are serving alcohol responsibly. Further, airlines should not check-in passengers that are deemed to be inebriated.












